

# ENROLLMENT OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AT PVCC

## ANNUAL REPORT 2016-17

### OVERVIEW

Each semester, hundreds of high school students enroll in credit courses at PVCC. The majority of these students are dual-enrolled in face-to-face classes at their high schools, receiving both high school and college credit for classes completed. There are also many public, private high school, and home-schooled students, taking PVCC classes online and/or coming to campus to take college classes. Overall, 2,010 high school students accounted for 5,794 enrollments and 17,248 total credits in academic year 2016-17. The table below summarizes the academic year 2016-17 enrollment of high school students at PVCC.

### DUAL-ENROLLMENT FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES IN REGIONAL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOLS

PVCC offered face-to-face dual-enrollment courses at Albemarle High School, Blue Ridge School, Charlottesville High School, Fork Union Military Academy, Fluvanna County High School, Louisa County High School, Monticello High School, Murray, Nelson County High School, Western Albemarle High School, William Monroe High School (including the Greene County Technical Center) in Academic Year 2016-17. During the year, there were 5,059 enrollments in these classes by 1,857 students, generating 15,069 total credits.

### VIRTUAL/ON-LINE CLASSES

An additional 181 public, private, or homeschool students enrolled in PVCC classes online, generating 819 total credits. Some high schools provide proctored class time for students to take PVCC courses online.

## **CLASSES ON A PVCC CAMPUS**

140 high school students took PVCC classes on a PVCC campus (i.e., at the main campus, the Jefferson City Center campus or the Giuseppe Center campus). This activity generated 1360 total credits.

## **COMMUNITY BENEFIT**

Due to the relationship that PVCC and surrounding public and private high schools have, students saved \$2,393,160 by taking courses as dual enrollment.

## **EARLY COLLEGE EXPERIENCE**

The Early College Experience provides high school students the opportunity to graduate with an associate's degree by the time they complete high school. For academic year 2016-17, there were 119 students enrolled as a part of this initiative. This academic year, Charlottesville High School (2 students), Fluvanna County High School (5 students), Louisa County High School (17 students), Nelson County High School (12 students), and William Monroe High School (83 students) had a significant number enrolled through this program.
